Honoring Mothers

Luke 10:38-42 (NIV)

As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. ³⁹She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. ⁴⁰But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" ⁴¹"Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴²but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

Summary:

In a culture that prioritizes cancelling out others over celebrating their accomplishments, "honor" seems to be a forgotten word. In society's shift to self-awareness and self-satisfaction, we have lost the understanding that valuing those around us is actually a good thing.

In today's sermon, through a discussion Jesus had with two sisters, Mary and Martha, we will see the encouragement that he provided for both women.

Application Questions:

- 2. Describe the spiritual practices you implement in order to slow down to "sit at the feet of Jesus"?
- 3. Would you describe yourself more as a Mary or a Martha?
